Historically, the Trilemma has been presented as a comparative ranking to be a conversation starter but this year we introduced indexation to enable tracking of energy policy performance since 2000. ### The capital of Kazakhstan, Nur-Sultan, wins the bid to host the World Energy Week 2021



Following review of all bids, the World Energy Council is pleased to announce Kazakhstan as the host the 2021 World Energy Week. Kazakhstan is a member of the World Energy Council through the KAZENERGY Association. In 2017 the concept of a clean energy transition to a green economy was adopted by the Kazakh government with significant reduction in energy intensity and greenhouse gas emissions and an increase of alternative energy sources in electricity generation. The Kazakhstan Member Committee is looking forward to welcoming the energy community to its capital in 2021.

#### **Innovation Forum Hydrogen**

The Council has organised this two-day Hydrogen Innovation Forum to develop a compelling business plan for large-scale low carbon hydrogen production. This session will also define the regulatory changes and policy incentives to enable hydrogen consumption. Finally, the Council will begin discussion on developing a charter to increase demand for low-carbon hydrogen.
